ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES, POSSESSION IN PUBLIC

It shall be unlawful for any person to consume any alcoholic beverage or to possess any opened container containing any alcoholic beverage, while such person is:

- 1. In, or on, or upon a stationary vehicle on a street or municipal highway or in a municipal parking lot, or
- 2. In, or on, or upon a vehicle on a sidewalk or in a so-called common area open to the public, or
 - 3. On a street or municipal highway or in a municipal parking lot, or
 - 4. On a sidewalk or
 - 5. On a so-called common area open to the public.

For purposes of this ordinance, "common area open to the public" shall include property to which public access is limited in duration and subject to conditions in addition to any imposed by this ordinance, and shall include: (a) any property owned or leased by the Town of Danville or the School District of the Town of Danville or any other instrumentality of the Town of Danville, (b) the public beach area at Joe's Pond so-called, and (c) whether or not included in the foregoing, any area of the Green in the Village of Danville Green.

Upon first obtaining a written permit from the Board of Selectmen, any publicly recognized organized group or organization, or family group, may be exempted from the provisions of this ordinance for short periods of time only, not to exceed 24 hours, for good cause shown. Such permits shall state with specificity the times and dates, and geographic areas, for which the exemption is in effect.

Any person violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be fined not more than \$15.00. Any person violating the provisions of this ordinance two (2) times within any calendar year shall be fined not more than \$50.00 or imprisoned not more than 5 days or both for such second violation within one calendar year. Any person violating the provisions of this ordinance three (3) or more times in any one calendar year shall be fined \$100.00 or imprisoned not more than 30 days, or both, for such third violation and for each subsequent violation.

The foregoing Ordinance was passed, enacted and adopted by unanimous affirmative vote of the Board of Selectmen of the Town of Danville, Vermont at a meeting duly called and held at the Town Clerk's Office in the Town of Danville on the 19th day of 1983. This became effective on the 30th day of 1983 at 12:01 A.M.
