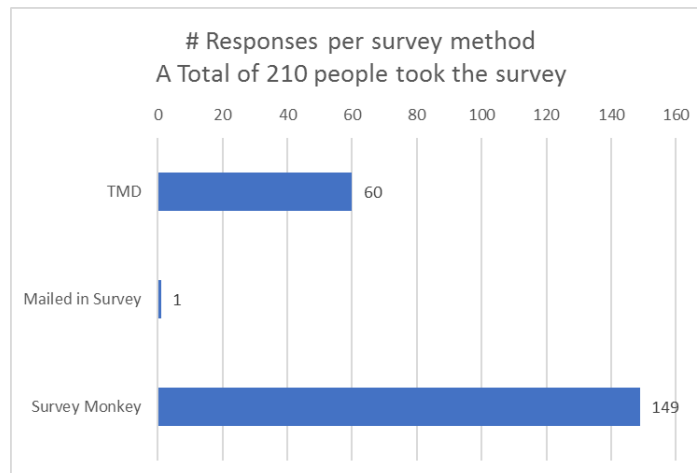
Figure 1. Description of the survey as shown to those who took the electronic version on Survey Monkey

In order to help gauge the people of Danville’s interest in having Zero-Sort Recycling brought to Danville, the Danville Selectboard conducted a survey. Danville citizens and residents had the opportunity to take a paper form of the survey at Town Meeting Day 2017. Then, the town created a Survey Monkey electronic version of the same survey and put a link to it on the Town website, which received responses beginning March 20th and ending April 5th, 2017. Folks taking the online survey saw the directions described in Figure 1, kindly asking that only Danville residents or landowners complete the survey and that if they had already completed the paper survey at Town Meeting Day, not to complete this one. It is possible that people from outside of Danville took the survey or that some people took the survey more than once both at Town Meeting Day and online. Those taking the online survey could not take the survey twice from the same computer or electronic device. One survey respondent mailed in their survey. A copy of the survey can be found at the end of this report.

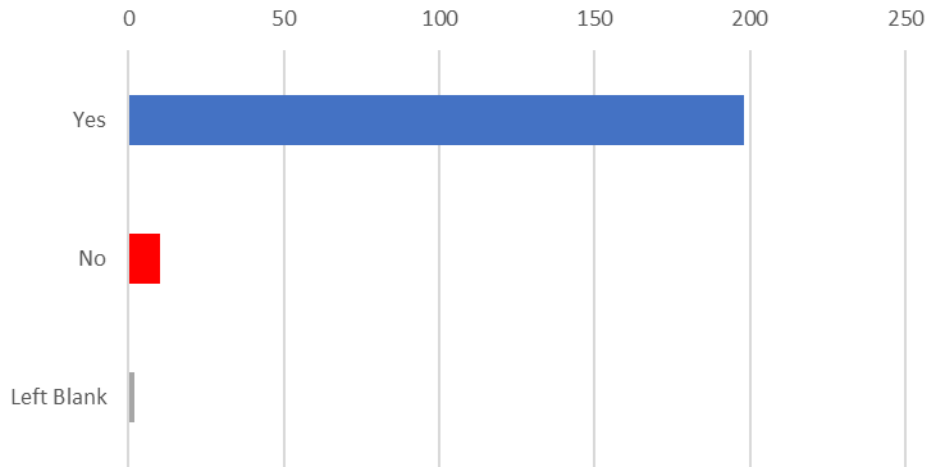

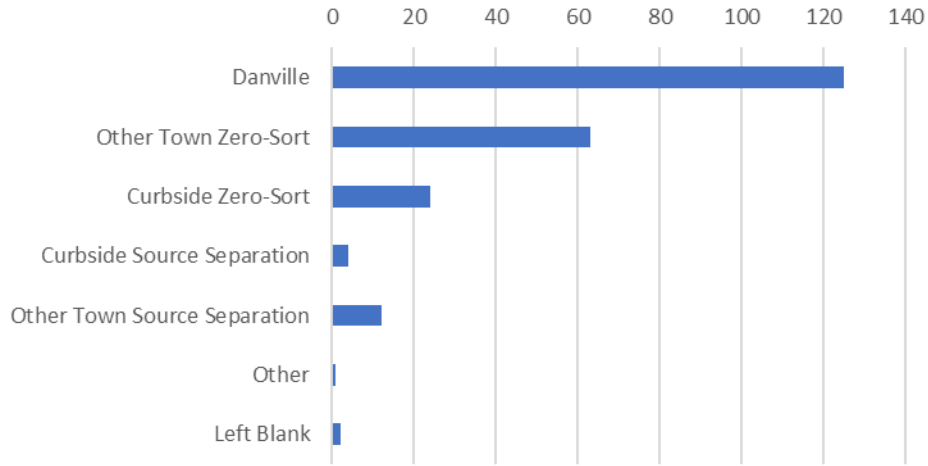

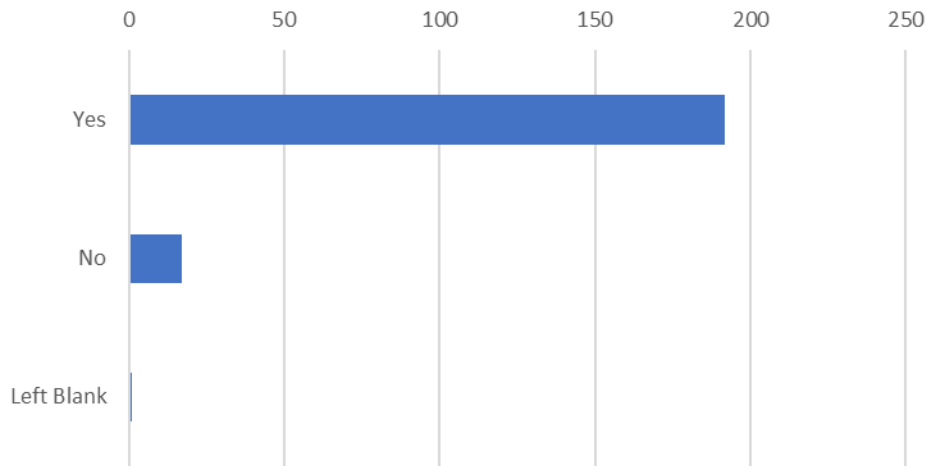
1) Do you currently recycle?

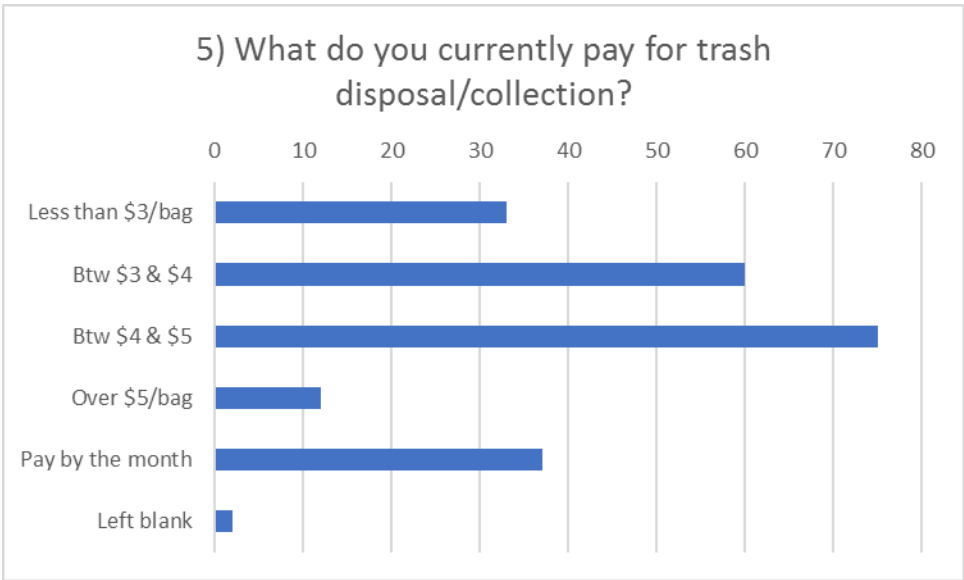
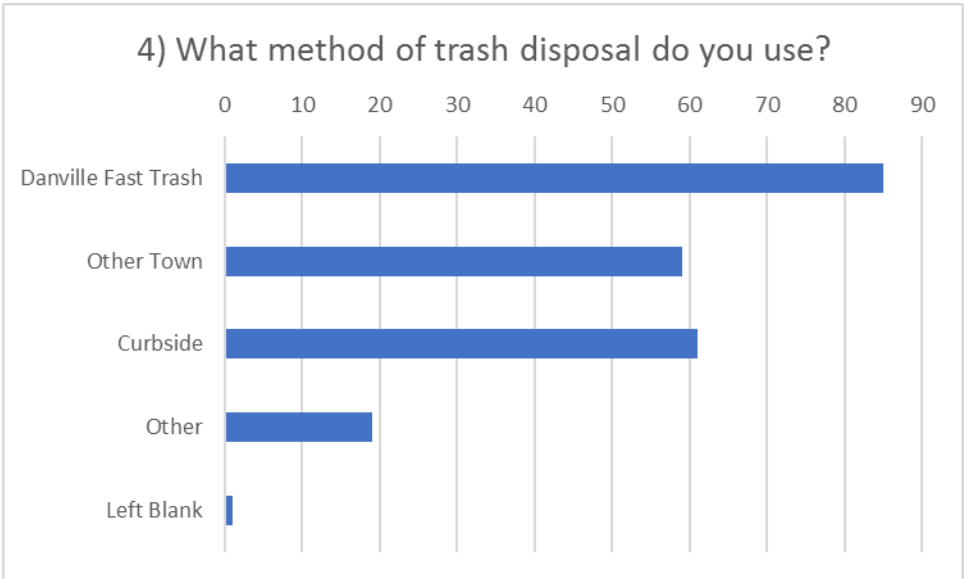


2) What method of recycling do you use?



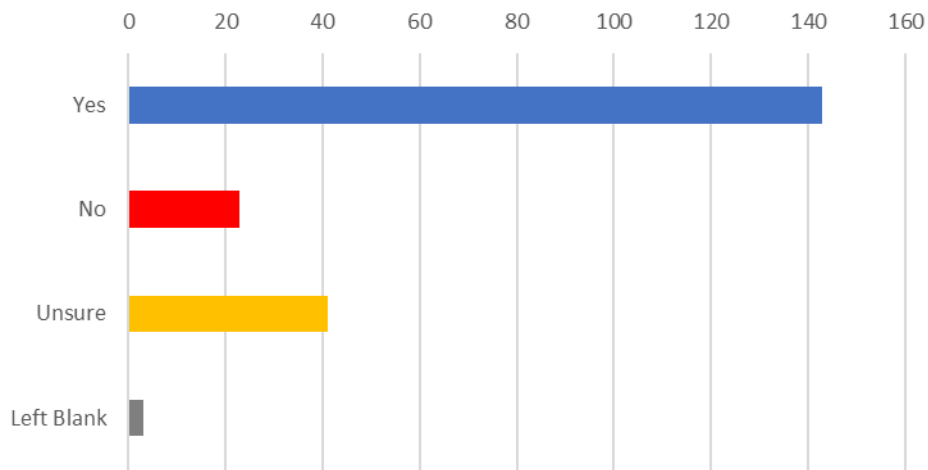
3) Do you currently pay for trash disposal?



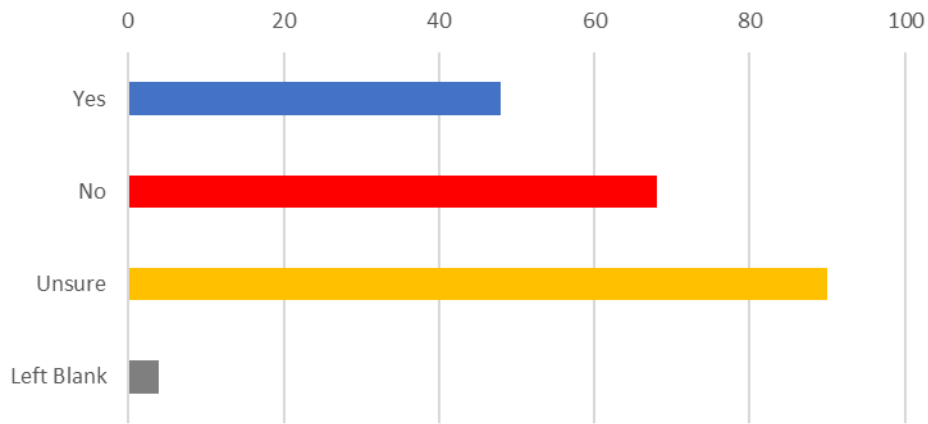


Question 6. Roughly how many bags of trash do you generate each week was not analyzed, but all individual responses are available upon request.

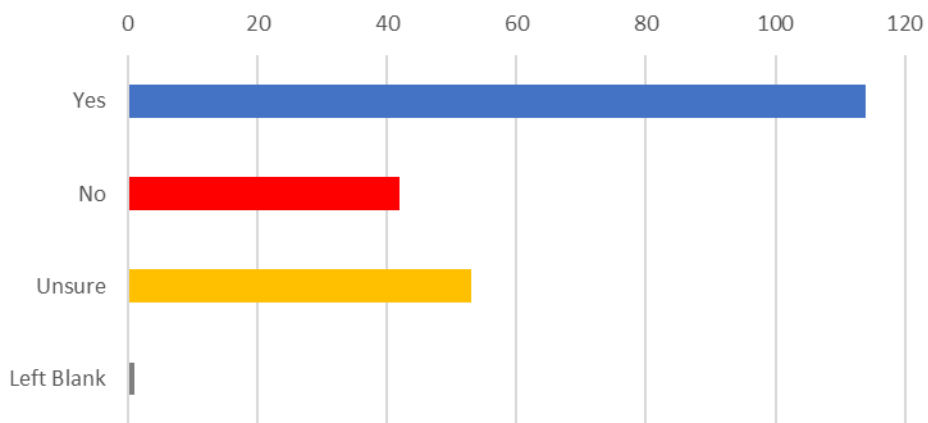
7) Would you like Zero-Sort Recycling in Town?



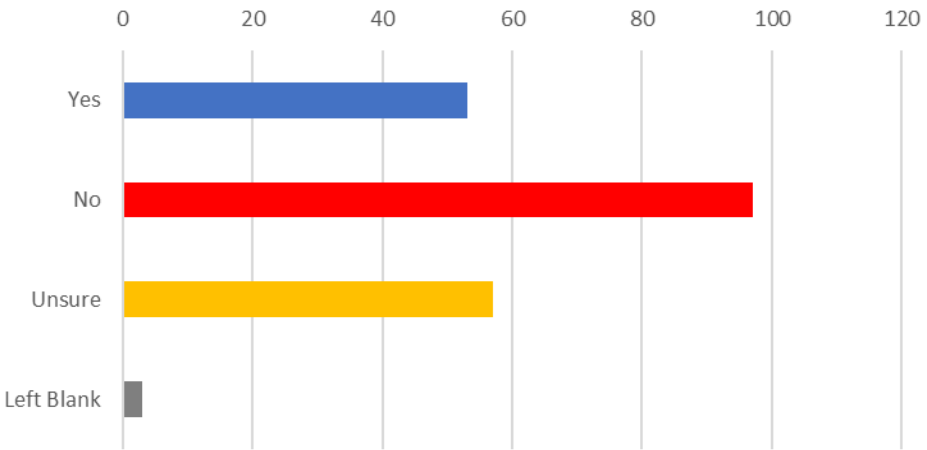
8) Would you be willing to help fund raise the cost of having Zero-Sort Recycling in Town?
